

The shallow coastal waters of the Isle of Man appear to be an important Risso's dolphin habitat in this part of the world. These data, from boat-based, land-based, and public sightings highlight an area of consistent summer seasonal use by Risso's dolphins with good sighting numbers. Photo-ID catalogue sizes and re-sighting rates are comparable to, or better than, other published British Isles 'hotspots' such as in Wales [1] and Scotland [2]. Re-sighting rates lower than the Azores [3] may suggest larger home ranges and wider use of the region as a whole. As a central point in this region the Isle of Man may serve as an important 'mixing' location for Risso's dolphins from the north and south which will only be evidenced by a greater focus on consistent photo-identification data and a strong collaboration between parties studying this fascinating species.
