Fisheries Act 2012

SEA FISHERIES (RESTRICTIONS) (ICCAT) REGULATIONS 2023

Laid before Tynwald:

Coming into Operation:in accordance with regulation 2

The Department of Environment, Food and Agriculture makes the following Regulations under section 36 of the Fisheries Act 2012, having —

- (a) consulted in accordance with section 83(2) and (5)(a) of the Act; and
- (b) satisfied itself as required under section 83(5)(b) of the Act.

1 Title

These Regulations are the Sea Fisheries (Restrictions) (ICCAT) Regulations 2023.

2 Commencement

These Regulations come into operation on the day after they are made¹.

3 Interpretation

In these Regulations —

"the Act" means the Fisheries Act 2012;

"ICCAT" means the International Convention for the Conservation of Atlantic Tuna;

"protected species" means any of the species listed in the Schedule;

"territorial sea" means the area between —

- (a) the mean high water mark; and
- (b) the seaward boundary of the Isle of Man's territorial sea (as defined by section 1 of the Territorial Sea (Consequential Provisions) Act 1991); and

"unauthorised person" means a person who does not hold either —

- (a) a sea fishing licence or is serving as a crew member of a fishing vessel which does not hold a sea fishing licence, issued in accordance with regulations made under section 37 of the Act; or
- (b) a scientific permit which permits any of the activities prescribed in regulation 4, issued by the Department in accordance with section 75 of the Act.

4 Prohibition on fishing protected species

It is prohibited for an unauthorised person fishing within the Island's territorial sea to take, catch, kill or land any protected species, by any method.

5 Incidental capture of protected species

In the event of a protected species being caught by an unauthorised person, the unauthorised person must take every reasonable step to ensure that the protected species is released alive and unharmed immediately in the territorial sea.

6 Offence

An unauthorised person is guilty of an offence if they capture a protected species and they do not comply with the duty prescribed in regulation 5.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations align the Isle of Man to the International Convention for the Conservation of Atlantic Tuna (ICCAT), by restricting the fishing of the protected species of fish specified in the Schedule.

It is an offence for any person or member of crew who does not hold a commercial fishing licence or a specific scientific permit, to take, catch, kill or land any of the protected species.

Where a protected species is inadvertently caught by an unauthorised person, they must take every reasonable step to ensure that it is not harmed and released alive as soon as possible.
